Milton Keynes Young Musician of the Year 2024

Seven piano and instrumental soloists from last weekend's music festival have been invited back to further showcase their performances. All performers will receive a special trophy and certificate and a small amount of prize money and one performer will be awarded the title Milton Keynes Young Musician of the Year. Each performer is asked to prepare two pieces of up to 12 minutes of repertoire of their own choice.

Our Judges

Nadia Hinson GRSM(Hons), LRAM, LTCL

Nadia graduated from the Royal Academy of Music after having studied the violin with Manoug Parikian and the piano with Jean Harvey. She was awarded first prize for Aural studies and her quartet won the string chamber prize in her final year. Nadia was the featured soloist playing the Lark Ascending and Bach double violin concerto for the Benslow Trust at St. James' Piccadilly having been awarded an instrument to continue her studies. Other concertos in her repertoire include performances of the Mendelssohn, Mozart no.3 and 4, Haydn in C, De Beriot, Viotti, and works by Beethoven and Finzi.



She began her career as a freelance violinist playing in many London

based orchestras. As an accompanist to singers and instrumentalists, she met her musician husband Nigel and together they founded the Veloce Ensemble (string quartet and clarinet quintet) touring throughout Britain performing specially commissioned works for that genre. Appearances at festivals and stately homes inspired a regular concert series at Belvoir Castle and Holmepierrepont Hall. As a recitalist throughout the East Midlands, Nadia has been highlighted in festivals and BBC features locally.

She is also currently the owner and director of the Hinson School of Music in Nottingham, and is an international examiner for the ABRSM, an adjudicator for The British and International Federation of Festivals, and a member of the Royal Society of Musicians.

Nadia has recently been appointed a senior consultant for the LEAD Academy trust, involved in developing music departments in schools in Nottinghamshire, and leading workshops to encourage and involve as many youngsters as possible in experiencing music and the arts in large scale productions and showcase concerts.

She has set up composition workshops to inspire children to explore feelings and ideas through music and is a mentor for the Trust to develop self-confidence and communication through learning and performance. Nadia has also recently been appointed to the ABRSM jazz examining panel.

Craig Greene



Pianist and conductor, Craig Greene, a former scholar of Christ Church, Oxford, graduating with a double first-class degree, Craig continued his Studies at the Royal College of Music with Dmitri Alexeev and Ashley Wass.

Craig won various prizes throughout his studies including the Oxford University Conducting Competition in 2008 and the RCM Chamber Music Prize in 2012.

Whilst at Oxford, Craig served as principal conductor of the Oxford University Philharmonia, and later became Musical Director of Opera

Lyrica, an independent opera company with whom he conducted productions of *Die Fledermaus*, *Fierrabras*, and *Il barbiere di Siviglia*.

Craig has been fortunate to perform as soloist with numerous orchestras including the Russian National Orchestra, the Orchestra of the Swan, the Milton Keynes City Orchestra, and the Oxford Chamber Orchestra, a group that he also regularly works with as a guest conductor. Craig frequently performs as a recitalist both locally and further afield and has been fortunate to perform alongside numerous leading singers and instrumentalists, most recently giving a recital alongside world-renowned oboist, Gordon Hunt.

In addition to performing, Craig pursues a busy teaching career having spent 5 years as a member of teaching staff at St Paul's School, London before serving as Director of Music at Stowe School. He currently teaches piano at St Helen & St Katharine and Bedford School.


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

Yiding Wang - Piano

Yiding is 11 years old and grew up in Milton Keynes. He recently moved to Oxford to attend Magdalen College School. He started playing the piano at age 5 and took up the organ in 2022, learning both under the guidance of Adrian Boynton. He has always nurtured an insatiable curiosity and an unwavering passion for music. This led him to achieve distinctions in all his ABRSM piano exams. In 2023, he achieved a high distinction in ABRSM Grade 4 organ. This year marks his fourth participation in Milton Keynes Festival, at which, over the years, he has won 4 gold, 10 silver, and 9 bronze medals. Under Adrian's guidance, he actively contributes to local church concerts, showcasing his piano skills. Last year, he began learning the cello at Magdalen College School with Mr. Simon Trentham. He is passionate about composing and dreams of becoming a great film composer like Hans Zimmer and John Williams. Music is his joy, and he is excited about every possibility ahead.

Sean Lau - Violin

Sean has been playing violin since the age of five. He is now 11 years old and currently learning violin with Juliet Hughes-Rees in the Royal College of Music Junior Department. In 2022, he got the Janet Tinbergen Memorial Award in the String Recital Classes at the Oxford Music Festival. In 2023, he had been awarded with the Junior Strings Challenge Cup at the Sutton Music Festival. Sean's enthusiasm and unwavering passion for playing the violin shine through in his performances.

Evie is particularly passionate about chamber music and plays both violin and viola in multiple ensembles, including a quartet at J & A Beare. She aspires to a future career in music.

However, due to the pandemic, her sister Reese took over as her teacher for both instruments. While continuing piano lessons with her sister, Reeka started taking violin lessons from Enrico Alvares, whose guidance helped her be accepted into the Purcell School in 2022. Since then she has been playing the violin as her primary instrument under Dr Tanja Goldberg, taking piano as a second study under Debbie Shah. She also enjoys jazz / pop-commercial singing as her third study under Jacqui Hicks. Recently she has performed in the Purcell Symphony and Middle School Orchestra, as well as played in a string quartet in an external concert. She is currently preparing to participate in the New Virtuosi Violin Mastercourse.

Waika Hagan Chu - Piano

Hagan has been playing the piano since he was 5, showing an interest in the instrument as he grew up. He is currently in Year 9. 

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
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












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Northampton Festival of the Performing Arts
