enter your new pupils.

form(s) for your own records if entering by post.

Email: You can send your form by email, but if you do so, you must pay your entry free

confirmation of payment.

SPEECH AND DRAMA SECTION



Speech and Drama adjudicator: Eleanor McLeod MA(Ed), DipEd, LLAM(Hons)

Eleanor comes from Swansea in Wales, where she first gained a love of the spoken word through taking LAMDA examinations, later gaining her LAMDA teaching diploma. She is also a qualified teacher with a Masters Degree in Education.

Eleanor has been a professional actress for most of her life, appearing on stage, television, radio and taking Shakespeare to schools all over the world for the British Council.

A member of the LAMDA examinations board, she is also a published author of three books of poetry for children. and three books of short dramatic scenes.



Speech and Drama adjudicator: Priscilla Morris LGSM, LLCM, LLAM(TD Hons), ALAM, PGCA

Priscilla was a member of the National Youth Theatre before training at the Guildhall School of Music & Drama in London. In 1972 she founded her own drama school in the Midlands, which she handed over to her daughter in 2013, although she continues to teach youngsters and adults at her home studio.

Priscilla was a LAMDA examiner for 34 years and examined throughout the UK, Eire, Spain, Belgium, Singapore, USA,

Malta, Sri Lanka the UAE, China and Vietnam. She has been an adjudicator in Speech & Drama for the British and International Federation of Festivals since 1991 and has adjudicated in Bermuda, Sri Lanka and Hong Kong.

Since 1998 she has been Voice Advisor to Swim England, for whom she delivers Voice Protection courses for swimming coaches nationwide and she is also a published author on Shakespeare.

Priscilla has directed and acted in over 40 plays, musicals and pantomimes during her performing life. Now, she spends most of her time in the business sector with her company, Loud & Clear voice coaching.

As a professional speaker she appears at conferences and seminars and enjoys entertaining audiences on P&O cruise ships.

We look forward to welcoming Eleanor and Priscilla to our 2024 festival.



Please also read the rules and information at the back of this syllabus

- A piece must not be repeated across the classes (including your recital).
- Only one grade per instrument may be entered in all graded classes, and entrants / parents / teachers are responsible for ensuring the correct grade has been selected. If you play a piece recognised by the adjudicator to be above the stated level you may not be placed.
- Standards are indicated either by age, grade, or by experience in tuition. Where a class is
 divided into grades, the entrant should be able to play to that standard, but not yet have
 passed a higher grade than that specified. The piece played must reflect the standard
 entered, ie a piece set for a grade 5 exam should not be played in an Elementary class, it
 should be played in an Intermediate class.
- Standards for entry for Piano and Instrumental classes are as follows:

Marking System

- Every performance will receive a certificate and written feedback and medals are awarded for first, second and third place, with cups or prizes awarded where designated.
- The categories awarded will be in accordance with the standards laid down by the British and International Federation of Festivals as follows:

Fair	A performance limited in its communication
Moderate	A performance showing development of technique and/or communication
Merit	A capable performance showing some artistic appreciation / technical ability
Commended	A convincing performance technically and artistically
Distinction	An excellent performance technically and artistically
Outstanding	An exceptional performance both technically and artistically

Non-competitive classes

These are for those solo performers who do not wish to compete, but would enjoy performing to an audience, receiving feedback from the adjudicator and a certificate. The only difference is that the performers will not compete with one another and will not be eligible for a cup/prize.

Accompanists

See **www.miltonkeynesfestival.org** for a list of pianists or you may use your own. The festival does not have official accompanists, so if you need an accompanist please make sure you make necessary arrangements for a rehearsal and your performance as soon <u>as you have confirmed</u> your entry.

You must expect to pay a fee to your pianist / accompanist for your festival performance and any rehearsals you arrange. Please deal direct with your pianist / accompanist and agree all fees and any rehearsal dates with him / her. If you are unable to attend your festival class, do make sure you inform your accompanist, or you may still be charged with the agreed fee.

Backing Track Accompaniment for Instrumental Classes

Use of Backing Track Accompaniment for Instrumental Classes:

To assist parents and teachers with the cost of entering the festival, instrumental (not voice or piano) performers in classes for grades Beginners, Preparatory and Elementary (grades up to and including grade 4) may choose to use a backing track accompaniment if they wish instead of a live accompaniment.

The track should be provided on either a CD or via a device which can be connected by Bluetooth to our playback machine. We have instigated this new option following feedback from parents and teachers. You can still have live piano accompaniment or no accompaniment at all if you prefer.

Your 2024 Music Festival Adjudicators



Piano Adjudicator Murray McLachlan MA(Cantab), LRAM

Murray McLachlan has been adjudicating for nearly 30 years and is based in Manchester. He has made over 40 commercial recordings which have consistently received outstanding reviews, including 'key recording' and 'rosette' status in the Penguin Guide to CDs.

He has performed on all five continents and is Head of Keyboard at Chetham's school of Music, Tutor at the Royal Northern College of Music and Founder/Artistic Director of the Chetham's International Summer school and festival for Pianists, Europe's largest summer school devoted exclusively to the piano.

In 2007, McLachlan launched the first Manchester International Concerto Competition for Young Pianists, an event that was held for the sixth time in 2019. Alongside his work as an Adjudicator for The British and International Federation of Festivals, he is Editor of 'Piano Professional' and 'Piano Journal' magazines, as well as a regular columnist for 'International Piano. His three Faber Music books on Piano Technique have received wide international acclaim and have been reprinted several times.



Piano Adjudicator Nancy Litten LRAM(pft), LRAM(vln), ATCL(Voice), FLCM(kbd), CertEd, ProfCertRAM

Nancy entered the Royal Academy of Music at age 16 on an open piano scholarship, winning prizes while there. She also studied violin to a high level, freelanced as an orchestral player, and led a string guartet.

Nancy has co-authored three violin tutors in the Playing with Colour series. She has performed as a soloist, chamber music and orchestral player on both instruments and as a piano accompanist. She has taught in primary, secondary and specialist music schools, privately and on

courses. Her arrangements of favourite piano pieces for piano trio (piano, violin and cello), Classical Vienna and Romantic Vienna are published by Alfred UK. in 2022 'Piano Postcards' a book of original solos for the intermediate pianist, was published by EVC Music.

Nancy has advised ABRSM and Trinity exam boards on electronic keyboard, had a series of keyboard tutors, Keyed Up, published by Alfred UK, and has written many compositions and arrangements for exam syllabuses. She was founder and director of National Electronic Keyboard Courses from 2005-2012. Singing is another string to her bow and she has many years' experience of conducting choirs. Choral and Vocal Warm-ups for Pianists, Choral and Vocal Sight Singing with Keyboard Harmony, and Rounds with Accompaniment have been published by Alfred UK.

Nancy has been an ABRSM examiner since 1998, involving much travel in the UK and abroad. She has been an adjudicator with The British and International Federation of Festivals since 2014 and serves on the Adjudicators' Council as one of the two music representatives.



Piano Adjudicator Jena Pang MA (Oxon), PGDL

Jena Chun-Wah Pang is based in the United Kingdom and has an international reputation for teaching and judging competitions and scholarship awards. His students are based in the United Kingdom, Hong Kong, Beijing, Malaysia, Geneva, Milan, Vienna, New York and Calgary, regularly compete in international competitions and music festivals around the world and have won several first, second and third prizes at the Clavis International Piano Competition 2018 in St Petersburg Russia; the

Amigdala International Piano Competition 2019 and 2021 in Italy; Feurich International Piano Competition 2019 and 2018 Vienna; Costa Festa International Piano Competition 2019 Spain; Canadian Music Competition 2019 (violin); Tadini International Piano Competition 2019 Italy; London Young Musician International Piano Competition 2020 and 2021; Harmonium Plus International Piano Competition Armenia 2020, Music and Stars International Piano Competition 2020; Monegro 88 Keys International Piano Competition 2021 Spain, Carmel Arts International Piano Competition USA 2022, and winners of the finals of the 2020 and 2023 EPTA-UK piano competition.

Several of his students have also won the prestigious Elena Cobb Star Prize Award and have performed at the Royal Albert Hall.

He has appeared on both British and Hong Kong television playing both piano and violin. Recent concert engagements have been collaborations with Dennis Lee, Chee Hung Toh and Graeme Humphrey.

Jena was awarded an instrumental scholarship to study Music at St Peter's College, Oxford University and studied the violin with Lydia Mordkovitch and the piano with Lora Dimitrova and had lessons with Christopher Elton, Ruth Waterman, Keith Pascoe, Brenda Farrow, Shalinee Jayatilaka and Elsie Brown.

He has been teaching the piano and violin for the last 30 years and is in high demand as a teacher and for judging competitions and scholarship awards internationally. He has given many concerts, lessons and masterclasses around the world.

He is currently the Piano Convenor and a trustee of the Southend Festival of Performing Arts (established in 1911), and trustee of the Freda Parry Scholarship Fund Competition, both of which he has been involved with running for the last several years.



Vocal Adjudicator Sarah Jefferies LRAM, ARCM

Sarah is a vocal graduate of the Royal Academy of Music, where she studied with Josephine Veasey and Patricia Clarke. Whilst at the Academy, Sarah was the recipient of many prizes including Early Music, Lieder and English Song. She was an active member of the opera course, singing roles by Britten, Strauss and Mozart.

Upon leaving the Academy, Sarah studied with Margreet Honig and Elly Ameling at the Sweelinck Conservatorium in Amsterdam. She has sung recitals and oratorios all over the Europe and was a member of the Opera

De Lyon, with whom she recorded many works including Schoenberg's 'Moses und Aron ' and Orf's 'Carmina Burana'.

Sarah is a visiting teacher of voice at Marlborough College in Wiltshire and and has adjudicated all over the Uk and the Middle East, as well as at some of the major conservatoires in the U.K.

Sarah has a real fascination for the workings of the human voice and enjoys helping her students of all ages and standards to improve their vocal abilities.

She has a beautiful cocker spaniel, Maisie, who she enjoys walking for miles on the Wiltshire Downs near her home.



Instrumental Adjudicator Kay Tucker AGSM, ARCM, LTCL, PGCA, PGCE

Kay was born in Sheffield, Yorkshire and began studies on the cello at the age of 12, continuing studies at the Guildhall School of Music and Drama. Her portfolio career has combined teaching and adjudicating with performing as a soloist, chamber musician and orchestral player. Since 1998, Kay has been in popular demand as an Adjudicator throughout the UK, having worked at well over 200 festivals including the National Festival of Music for Youth. 'Encouragement' is a key word in all aspects of Kay's work and she has great joy in working alongside musicians of all

ages, particularly the very young.

Kay's passion for teaching led her to develop an early years strings & general musicianship system known as 'Stringbabies'. Since its inception in 2004, 'Stringbabies' has become well established and accepted as a leading approach in strings teaching (surprisingly to all ages!) and is being delivered throughout the UK and abroad in individual teaching practices, schools and music services. In 2016, Musicbabies for Recorder was published, being the first adaptation of Stringbabies for a non-stringed instrument.

Over recent years, Kay worked as a consultant to Trinity Guildhall, selecting and co-selecting repertoire for graded exams and diplomas. Kay was a Trustee and member of the Executive council of the European String Teacher's Association (ESTA).

In 2018 she was presented with the ESTA award for exceptional services, in recognition of her work in initiating the Post Graduate Certificate in string teaching accredited by Chichester University.

Kay became an Adjudicator Member of the British and International Federation of Festivals in 1997 and undertook the Post-graduate Certificate in Adjudication in 1999/2000.



Vocal Adjudicator Elizabeth Emberson AGSM, CT, ABRSM

Soprano soloist, choral conductor and voice teacher, Elizabeth began singing lessons with Betty Middleton when she was eleven years old, and quickly established herself on the festivals circuit in the North of England, winning many prizes in the process. At eighteen she went to the Guildhall School of Music, where she studied with Joyce Newton and Anna Berenska, spending a year on the Opera Course there.

Whilst at the Guildhall she won the English Song Prize, was a semifinalist in the Susan Longfield Award and gained several scholarships

for further study.

On leaving the Guildhall, she studied with Erich Vertheer and John Kitchener. Using her maiden name (Watson), Elizabeth's singing career took her all over England, France and Eire, before she decided to concentrate on her teaching career. She now teaches at two highly respected girls' schools in Oxford.





RULES AND INFORMATION

The festival is intended for amateurs

- Professionals may take part as Adjudicators, Accompanists, Conductors and Officials.
- For the purpose of the festival, professionals are those for whom income is, or
 has been, derived from the branch of the profession in which they wish to compete or
 perform or who have completed a full-time college course in the specialist subject in which
 they wish to compete or perform.

The committee reserves the right to:

- accept or reject any proposed entry.
- sub-divide or combine classes with a large or limited number of entries.
- appoint replacement or additional adjudicators and to alter, modify or cancel any of the arrangements detailed in the syllabus.

Entries

The entries should be sent to Entry Secretary by the date specified.

Age Limit

In all sections the operative day for determining age is <u>1 February</u>.

Standards

- Standards are indicated either by age, grade, or by experience in tuition. Where a class is divided into grades, the entrant should be able to play to that standard, but not yet have passed a higher grade than that specified.
- The piece played must reflect the standard entered, ie a piece set for a grade 5 exam should not be played in an Elementary (grade 4) class. Only one grade may be entered in all graded classes, and entrants and/or teachers are responsible for ensuring the correct grade has been selected.

Multiple Entries

- (Music Classes only) Entrants may perform once only in each class, except in duet, trio or ensemble classes where an entrant may perform more than once provided a different part is performed. Entrants who are members of more than one choir or ensemble are permitted to perform as a member of each choir or ensemble to which they belong.
- (Speech Classes only): A performer may only enter a class once. When performing in a duologue or group class a second entry is permitted provided a different part with a different partner/group is performed.

Own Choice Pieces

- The festival is under a legal obligation to supply the Performing Rights Society with details of all items to be performed.
- Own choice titles and composers must be given on the entry form for all sections.
- A copy of each Own Choice piece must be handed to the adjudicator's steward at the time of the performance.

• Photocopies are acceptable provided an original is used for the performance. The photocopy will be retained and destroyed after the adjudication of the class.

Speech & Drama Section

- Entrants do not have to seek copyright permission for any poetry, prose or solo dramatic items performed, to a time limit of 10 minutes.
- Duologues and group dramatic activity are not covered by this agreement, and copyright for these items should be sought by performers at the time of entry.
- Solo dramatic items must be announced with title and author at the time of performance to qualify for copyright indemnity, and the performer must not change the words or gender of the character.

Time Limits

- The time limit for each class is shown in the syllabus and this must be strictly adhered to.
- Any performance in which there is an excessive overrun of the time limit will be stopped by the adjudicator or adjudicator's clerk.
- Where the performance is obviously ending as the time limit is reached, the adjudicator's steward will allow the performance to conclude, but will inform the adjudicator when the time limit is reached, and his/her category and remarks will not cover material performed after the time limit is exceeded.
- Although time limits are specified you are required to time your piece/s and enter this under "Performance Time" as accurately as possible on the Entry Form.

Photocopying of Music

The festival cannot legally allow anyone to play/perform from photocopied music and has no choice but to disqualify performers who do so, unless before their class starts, they can produce evidence showing that the publisher's agreement has been sought and given.

The only photocopies the festival can allow in law are:

- Copies for the adjudicator's use, which will be destroyed at the end of each class.
- For an awkward page-turn which may hinder a performance.

Accompanists

• Entrants are advised that the festival does not engage official accompanists. There are suggestions on the festival website or you may bring your own.

Notification of time, date and venue of performers' classes

Performers will be notified as to the time, date and venue of their class/es as soon as possible after closing date for entries, and not later than 21 days before the commencement of their section. This information will be emailed to you if an email address has been provided.

Certificates

- All entrants will be issued with a certificate and an adjudication, providing the Festival rules have been complied with.
- The categories awarded will be in accordance with the standards laid down by the British and International Federation of Festivals as follows:

Fair	A performance limited in its communication
Moderate	A performance showing development of technique and/or communication
Merit	A capable performance showing some artistic appreciation and/or technical ability
Commended	A convincing performance technically and artistically
Distinction	An excellent performance technically and artistically
Outstanding	An exceptional performance both technically and artistically

• The winners of each class will be announced. Further placings will be awarded at the discretion of the adjudicator. (Please see sections for specific arrangements.)

Adjudicators

- Only festival officials directly concerned with the section may approach the adjudicator while the session is in progress.
- The adjudicator may stop any performance when his or her judgement has been formed. The adjudicator's decision in all cases is final.

Photography and Recording

- No photography, videotaping or audio recording is permitted of any live performance at any festival event by anyone, other than official photographers authorised by the organisers, in any circumstances. Please respect this rule and do not attempt to photograph any performer.
- Photographs of trophy/medal presentations will only be permitted with the express consent of the adjudicator, organiser and parents of the children concerned.
- In order to assist in promotion of the festival, the press, television and radio may be invited to attend and the festival may engage an official photographer. All photographs, video or film recording will be limited to the performance area, in the presence of festival officials.
- Parents or teachers entering children individually or in groups will be asked to indicate on entries those children who are not to be photographed, video-taped or filmed.

Child Protection

• The Festival's Child Protection Policy and approach to Creating Safer Festivals for Everyone is published explicitly in our Syllabus, Programme and Website. By completing and signing the entry form (or online entry system) all parents / guardians / carers and teachers of entrants under 18 (or vulnerable adults of any age) confirm that they give (or have obtained) the necessary consents for the entrants to take part in the Festival. Without consent the entry to the festival cannot be accepted.

Any decision of the Committee in all matters arising out of, or not specifically covered in these rules, is final.

Child Protection Policy Milton Keynes Festival of the Arts for Music, Dance and Drama

The British and International Federation of Festivals for Music, Dance and Speech works for amateur festivals everywhere to help create thousands of educational performance opportunities for children and young people each year.

The Federation, and our member Festivals, are committed to ensuring safe environments for children and young people and believe that it is always unacceptable for a child or young person to experience abuse of any kind.

We recognise our responsibility to safeguard the welfare of all children and young people, by a commitment to recommend best practice which protects them.

This policy applies to our Board of Trustees, paid staff, Adjudicator members, volunteers, students or anyone working on behalf of the Federation and our member Festivals.

We recognise that:

- the welfare of the child/young person is paramount.
- all children, regardless of age, disability, gender, racial heritage, religious belief, sexual orientation or identity, have the right to equal protection from all types of harm or abuse
- working in partnership with children, young people, their parents, carers and other agencies is essential in promoting young people's welfare.

The purpose of the policy:

• to provide protection for the children and young people who participate in our festivals, including the children of festival members. to provide staff and volunteers with guidance on procedures they should adopt in the event that they suspect a child or young person may be experiencing, or be at risk of, harm.

We will seek to safeguard children and young people by:

- valuing them, listening to and respecting them
- adopting child protection guidelines through procedures and safe working practice for staff and volunteers
- recruiting staff and volunteers safely, ensuring all necessary checks are made
- sharing information about child protection and safe working practice with children, parents, staff and volunteers
- sharing information about concerns with agencies who need to know, and involving parents and children appropriately
- providing effective management for staff and volunteers through supervision, support and training.
 - The Federation will review this policy each year in November in line with any changes in legislation or guidance.

Child Licensing Regulations regarding Child Performances (children aged 16 or under)

The children involved in the festival will be authorised by a Body of Persons Approval organised by the festival with Milton Keynes Council.

Body of Persons Approval (BOPA)

 A BOPA removes the need to apply for individual licences for child performers and it is granted to the organisation that is responsible for the performances, ie Milton Keynes Festival. It is therefore the organisation that is approved as a suitable group. It can apply to one performance, or a series of performances so covers our whole festival. The dance section of the festival will organise its own BOPA.

The festival performances must meet at least one of the following to require a BOPA:

- A charge was made in connection with the performance (e.g an admission fee)
- It took place on licensed premises for alcohol supply
- It was broadcast performance
- It was recorded to be broadcast
- Performances organised and produced by your child's school are exempt.

In order to satisfy the local authority that our festival is a suitable organisation to be granted a BOPA, the local authority needs to see evidence of the following:

- Clear and robust safeguarding policies
- Designated Safeguarding Officer
- A regularly updated Child Protection Policy in place
- Evidence of any safeguarding training undertaken by festival team
- DBS checking of volunteers
- The supervision of children from sign-in to sign-out, including provision for supervision backstage if applicable.
